Biographical History:

Henry Bertram was born on January 19, 1856, the second son of John Bertram and Elizabeth Bennet. He married Jennie Graham on September 26, 1881 at the home of the bride's parents Andrew Graham and Jessie Smith. Together they had seven children: Louise Winnifred Bertram born July 27, 1882, Jennie Kirkhope Bertram born July 25, 1884, Henry Graham Bertram born May 9, 1886, Stirling Aimers Bertram born August 19, 1888, Lennard Halliday Bertram born February 10, 1893, Elizabeth (Bessie) Bennet born October 29, 1894, and Andrew Alexander Bertram (Tim) born April 14, 1900. Jennie Graham died June 19, 1939 and was buried in Grove Cemetery in Dundas. Henry Bertram died November 3, 1945 and was buried with his wife in Grove Cemetery.

Henry Bertram was born in Dundas and spent his first two years living there before the economic situation forced his father to move the family to Kent County. Henry spent the next five years in Kent County in a log house constructed by his father on their hundred acre bush farm. In 1862, John Bertram moved his family back to Dundas and resumed his engineering career. After gaining some success in the business, he constructed the Bertram family house of Glenholme and this is where Henry Bertram would reside until he constructed his own house at 76 Alma Street in Dundas, in either 1876 or 1878. He would reside in this house until the death of his father in 1906, at which time he moved back into Glenholme and remained there until his death in 1945.

Henry Bertram attended the Dundas Public and High Schools after his family returned to Dundas after living in Kent County. After high school, at the age of 15, Henry Bertram began a five year apprenticeship in the shop of McKechnie and Bertram. He worked 10 hour days and took night classes in mechanical drawing from W.A. Edwards, a pattern maker and a graduate of the Manchester School of Science. By the age of 16, Henry was a member of the militia. After finishing his apprenticeship, Henry was stricken with typhoid and was bedridden for several months, upon his recovery he attended a commercial college, Canada Business College, located in Hamilton where he was trained for business.

Henry Bertram began his career as an apprentice in his father's shop of McKechnie and Bertram. After completing his training he took a job building water wheels in a shop near Picton in Prince Edward County. After a year in Picton, Henry returned to Dundas and worked in the Bertram shop. His positions before 1900 are not clearly known; it is clear that in 1886 he was made a partner and this is reflected in 1901, when the company was incorporated, as he was shown as a stockholder. During this period, Henry Bertram was also elected mayor of Dundas in 1898. After the death of his father, in 1906, Henry became secretary-treasurer and in active management of the works. There is some indication that Henry may have been made secretary-treasurer in 1901 not in 1906. When Alexander Bertram moved to Montreal in 1912, Henry was entirely in charge of the Bertram shop in Dundas. In 1926, Henry was the prime architect of the purchase of John Bertram & Sons Co. from the Niement Pond Company. Following this event Henry had what appears to have been a stroke during a vacation to Australia and subsequently reduced his role in the company shifting power to his son Henry Graham Bertram.

Henry Bertram had several passions outside of his business interests. These included rifle shooting in his younger days, culminating in his participation on the Canadian team at Bisley in 1894. Henry's true passion in his life was growing flowers, primarily roses and peonies. He had extensive gardens located on the Glenholme estate. In 1924 and 1925, he was awarded the highest points at the Ontario Rose show and many articles were published about his flowers. Henry Bertram was also a member of The Hamilton Club, Valley Lodge No. 100 A.F. & A.M. and St. Paul's United Church where he served as chairman of the board of stewards.

Custodial History:

The custodial history of this fonds is not clear. It appears that the fonds came into the possession of Henry Bertram's son, Henry Graham Bertram. After the death of Henry Graham, the records may have entered into the care of one or more of his children or were directly donated to the Dundas Historical Society Museum.

Scope and Content:

The fonds consists of the private records of Henry Bertram; the documents are primarily his personal correspondence and research into the Bertram family history. There are also a few of Henry Bertram's financial records in the fonds as well. The correspondence is with friends and family with correspondents including: Andrew Bertram, Alexander Bertram, Belle Armfelt, Henry Graham Bertram, various members of the Stirling family, Aimers Stirling

Bertram, Lennard Halliday Bertram, J.S. Wort, William Notman, the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, a colonel Smith, Thomas Cantley, Kenneth Carruthers, and a miscellaneous collection of single letters from other correspondents. The fonds also contains a number of wedding invitations, funeral notices, and postcards. There is some business correspondence in this fonds primarily with Alexander Bertram, whose correspondence is a mix of personal and business and with the Industrial Accident Prevention Association Incorporated. The second largest part of the fonds is Henry's genealogical research that includes correspondence about the family, handwritten notes and family trees, copies of vital documents (birth, death, and baptism records). Henry had also conducted some research into the history of the 77th Wentworth Regiment, which was included with his genealogy research. In the fonds there are also records relating to Glenholme, primarily fire insurance documents from the 1930's and 1940's. There are also a small collection of records relating to the death of his son Aimers Stirling Bertram. The fonds also includes a wide range of photographs and newspaper articles focusing on the John Bertram & Sons Co., the Bertram family, and Glenholme these cover the period from about 1894 to 1930. There are also two diaries kept by Henry Bertram, a personal one from 1914 and one from 1898 when Henry Bertram was Mayor of Dundas. The fonds also contains a few business records from the John Bertram & Sons Co., primarily donation, stockholders, and merger records from 1917 to 1926.

The fonds consists of the following types of records: correspondence (letters and telegraphs), photographs, newspaper clippings, postcards, machine shop specifications, ink drawings, copies of death certificates, copies of birth records, copies of baptism records, copies of parish records, copy of a ship registration, handwritten family trees and notes, event programmes, mortgage records, estate records, fire insurance records, stock holder meeting agendas and motions, memoranda of agreement, school reports, journal articles, and diaries.

The series in this fonds have been arranged in chronological order by the archivist, as the majority of the records showed no sign of a coherent order or any sign of their original order. There are a few small additions in this including Series 1 - [Correspondence](#) 1887 – 1943: Sub - series 3 - [Alexander Bertram](#) 1909 – 1926 which was found to be primarily in its original order with letters and responses glued to each other. This series was expanded to include all of the correspondence with Alexander Bertram that was found in several folders and most of which was lacking any clear order. The original core of correspondence at the center of this series were the business/personal letters sent between Henry and Alexander between 1919 and 1920. Series 1 - [Correspondence](#) 1887 – 1943: Sub - series 8 - [Leonard Bertram](#) 1915 – 1918 was also found to be in a

preserved chronological order. Series 1 - [Correspondence](#) 1887 – 1943: Sub - series 7 - [Aimers Stirling Bertram](#) 1914 – 1917 was found in an imperfect chronological order that was preserved by the archivist. The only other series in the fonds to have been found in what appears to be its original order was Series 1 - [Correspondence](#) 1887 – 1943: Sub - series 11 - [William Notman](#) 1928 – 1931. The records in Series 2 - Family History Research: Sub - series 8 - [History of 77th Wentworth Regiment](#) 1937 was found to have been numbered by Henry Bertram, although the records were not in their numbered order; the archivist has restored these to their numerical sequence. This series is also related to a series in the Henry Graham Bertram fonds as Graham took up his father's correspondence and interest in the 77th Wentworth Regiment. Several photocopies and inventories of records were made by Janet Bertram during her research and were mixed in with the original documents, copies and inventories have been left where they were found to preserve the influence of Janet Bertram Brown upon the fonds.
